



FINAL TRANSNATIONAL PARTNERS MEETING

3 - 4 MARCH, 2026

The final international meeting of the Cyber Safe Senior project took place on 3-4 March 2026 in Łódź, Poland, hosted by Instytut Nowych Technologii.

Partners reviewed the project achievements, discussed the results of the activities carried out so far and shared their experiences from working with seniors in their countries.

The meeting also focused on the final dissemination activities and the official launch of the information campaign. It was a great opportunity to strengthen cooperation, exchange ideas and celebrate everything we achieved together throughout the project.



VIRTUAL LESSONS

Project partners worked together to create 10 Virtual Lessons designed especially for older adults. Each lesson focuses on one of the most common online risks and everyday situations that seniors may face while using the internet.

The lessons cover topics such as social media scams, online medical services, privacy protection, smishing, computer and email security, phishing, emotional scams, financial fraud, online shopping scams and scams involving trusted institutions.

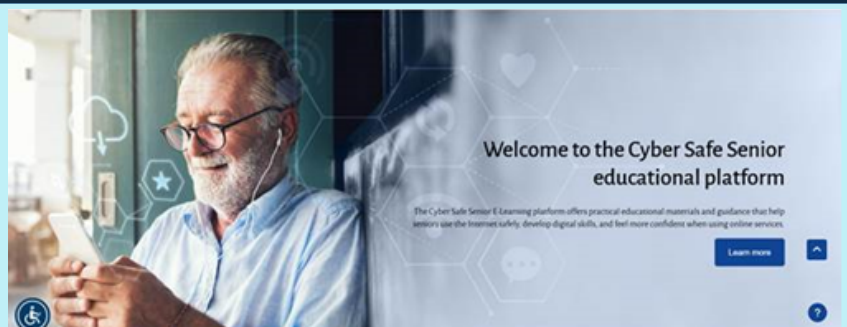
All lessons were reviewed and improved by the project partners to ensure high educational quality, clear content and an easy-to-use learning experience.

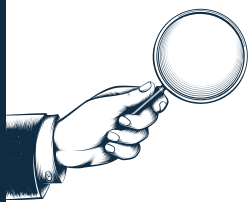
WELCOME TO THE CYBER SAFE SENIOR E-LEARNING PLATFORM

The Cyber Safe Senior e-learning platform offers practical learning resources that help older adults use the internet safely, improve their digital skills and feel more confident online.

The platform presents the Virtual Lessons in a simple, user-friendly format designed especially for senior learners. Each lesson begins with a short introductory video, followed by interactive exercises that help users recognise online scams and protect their personal data.

At the end of every lesson, participants can complete a short quiz to check what they have learned and reinforce their knowledge.





INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

As part of the Cyber Safe Senior project, partners organised information meetings for seniors and educators in all partner countries to present the project results and educational materials.

Participants explored the Cyber Safe Senior e-learning platform, discovered practical resources on online safety and learned how to use them in everyday life as well as in educational activities.

The meetings had a practical focus. Participants explored sample lessons, tested selected platform features and shared their experiences, questions and challenges related to using the internet and digital technologies.

RESULTS OF THE INFORMATION CAMPAIGN

The information campaign attracted strong interest from both seniors and educators working with older adults.

More than 180 educators and around 150 seniors took part in the meetings, exceeding the participation targets set for the project.

Feedback was overwhelmingly positive. More than 80% of participants described the meetings as valuable and useful. Educators appreciated the practical nature of the materials, while seniors said the knowledge they gained would help them use the internet and online services more safely in their everyday lives.



PILOT TRAINING

Within the scope of the Cyber Security for Seniors Project, the project partners conducted pilot training sessions in their respective countries on safe online behavior for older adults. A total of 157 older adults participated in these training activities.

Participants' Feedback and Training Outcomes

The training format was engaging and easy for participants to follow. Older participants particularly appreciated the practical exercises, real-life examples of online fraud, and the clear explanations provided by the trainers.

Some challenges were related to more complex or technical topics, such as deepfakes and cryptocurrencies. Although the training content was generally accessible, this indicated that some topics may require a slower pace or additional ...



INFORMATION CAMPAIGN IN TÜRKİYE

The İlk Sen Ol organization organized an information meeting for older people and educators. During the meeting, the project results and the Cyber Secure Seniors platform were presented. Participants had the opportunity to learn about educational materials on online safety and how these materials can be used in practice. The meeting also provided an opportunity to exchange experiences, questions, and challenges related to internet use.

INFORMATION CAMPAIGN IN POLAND

The Institute of New Technologies Association organized an information meeting for older people and educators, introducing the project's educational materials, the training program for educators, and the Cyber Secure Seniors platform. Participants had the opportunity to explore sample lessons and materials available on the platform and learn how they could be used in educational practices. The meeting also had a practical aspect; participants were able to test selected elements of the platform and discuss their experiences related to using new technologies.

INFORMATION CAMPAIGN IN GREECE

IED organized an information meeting dedicated to cybersecurity topics. The event was conducted in an interactive format and was based on real-life examples, allowing participants to easily relate the knowledge they gained to their own experiences. During the meeting, the project's educational materials and interactive learning tools supporting safe internet use were also presented.

INFORMATION CAMPAIGN IN SLOVENIA

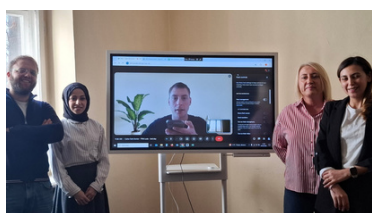
Simbioza Association organized an information meeting where the Cyber Secure Seniors platform and educational materials on online safety were presented. Participants learned practical tips on how to stay safe online and how to recognize common online fraud methods. The meeting also provided a space for sharing experiences and discussing challenges related to the use of digital technologies.
